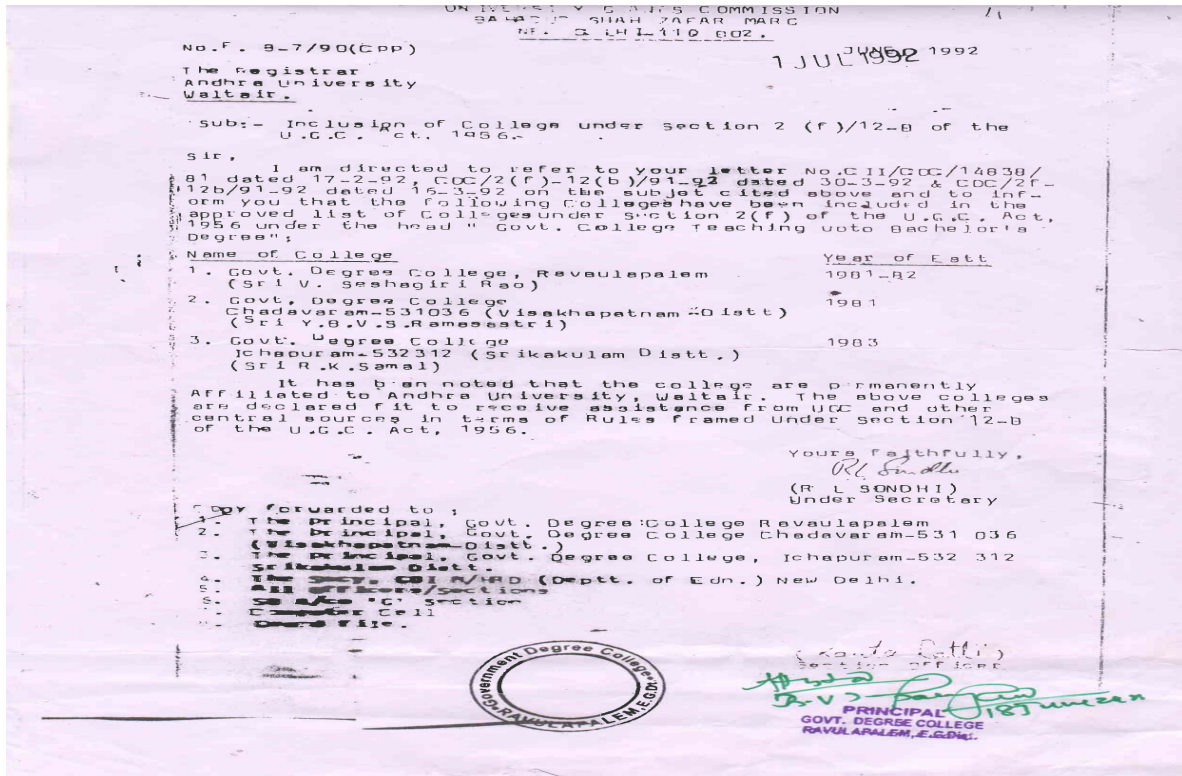

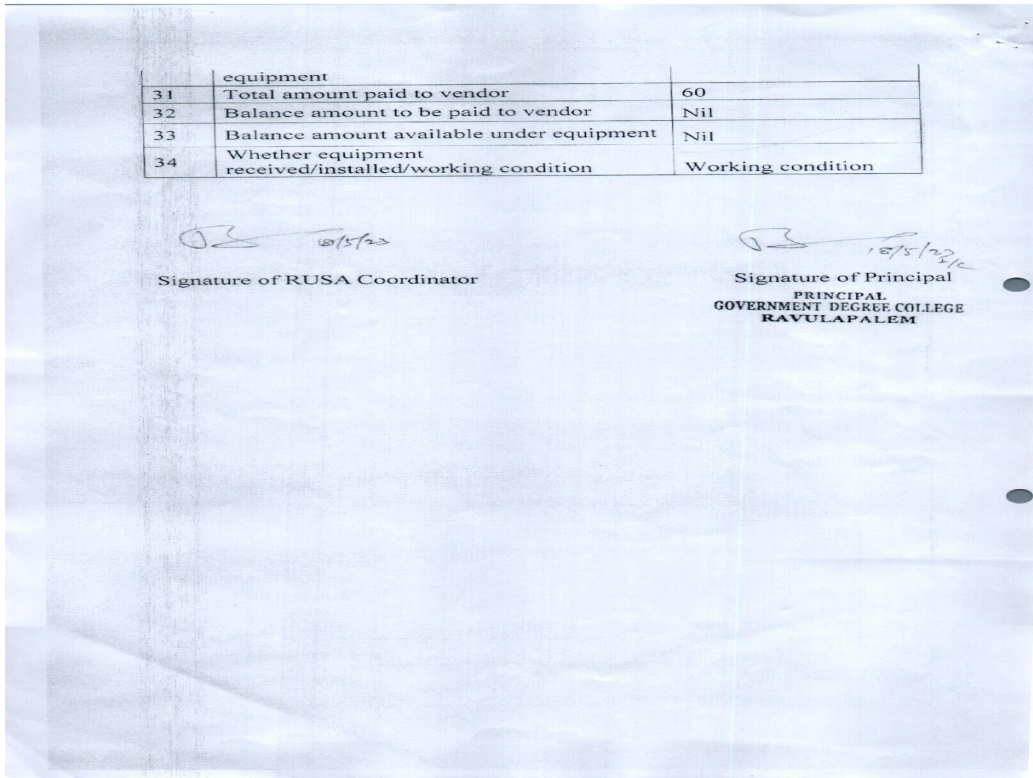

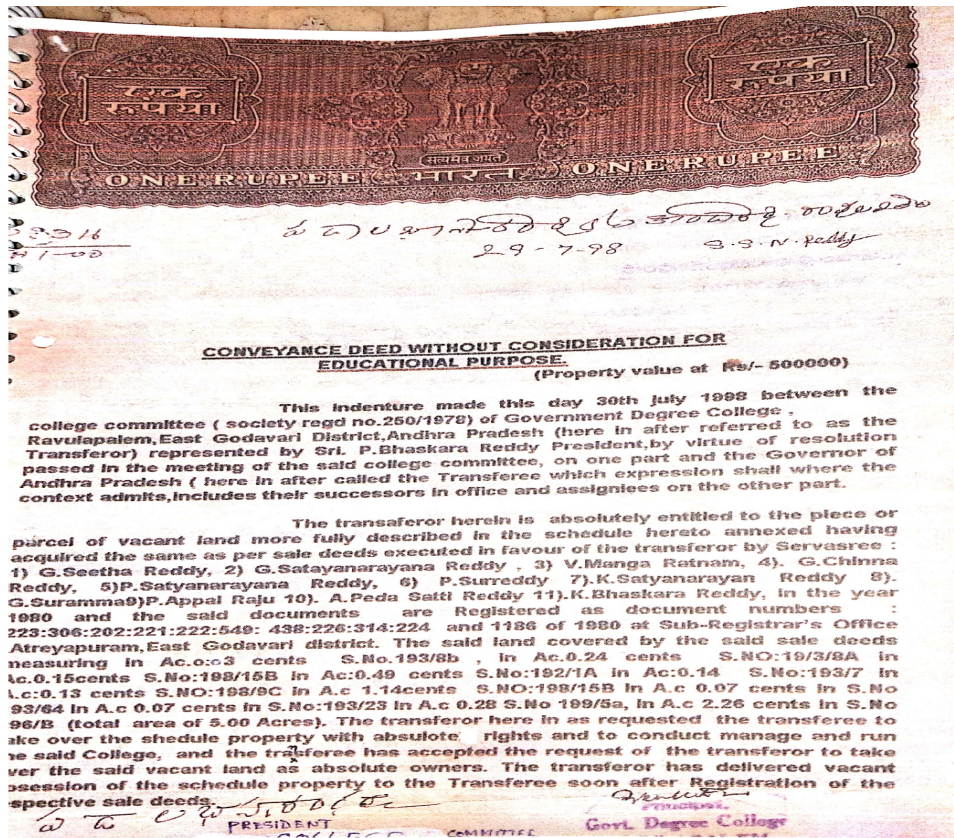

For want of legal title deed in respect of Schedule land in favor of transferee, it becomes an hurdle for the Govt. Degree College, Ravulapalem to get grants for the improvement. Hence this conveyance deed with out consideration .

Now this indenture witnesses that in pursuance of the above acceptance the transferor here by grants , transfers and settle by way of conveyance with out consideration for educational purpose for promoting education the schedule property together with hedges, ways ,water courses, liabilities,privileges, and all appertenance ,to the schedule land and all the rights title interest,claims and demand whatever of the transferor upto and upon that same to have and to hold the land here by granted , conveyed and assigned to the transferee absolutely and forever and the transferee having lawfully and peacefully already entered into and upon the said premises shall be entitled to hold and enjoy the same with absolute rights of ownership and receive the rights of ownership, without interruption or disturbance by the transferor or any person claiming through the transferor.





The transferor covenants with the transferee that the transferor has perfect title and right over the schedule property, shall be vested with the transferee by the said property with absolute rights.

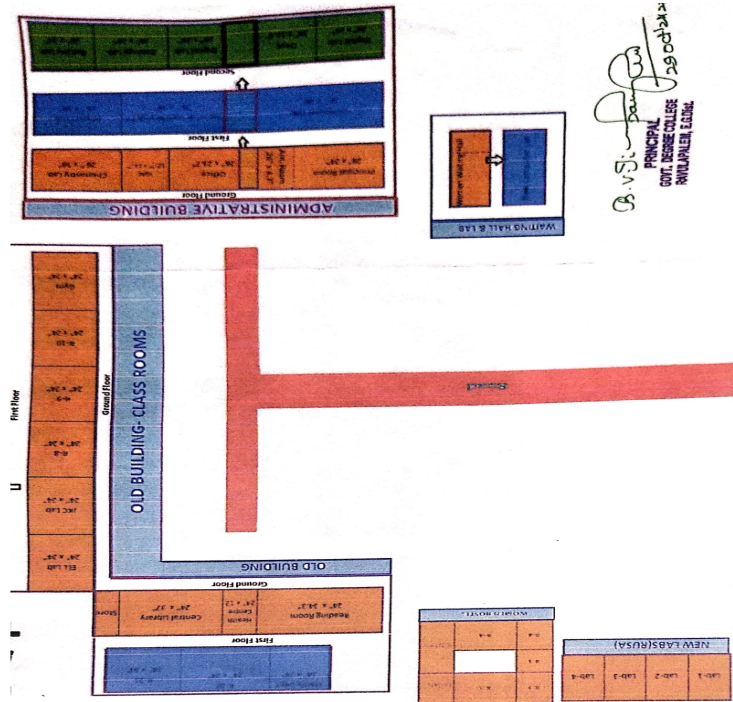

The schedule land do not come under the purview of land as defined in section 2(4) of A.P. Record of rights in land and Pattadar pass books Act, 1971. As it was exclusively in NON-Agricultural use. As per A.P. Government Revenue Department Circular No. 1732 Dt 11.11.1964 there is exemption of stamp duty and registration fees on conveyance deeds without consideration transferring all properties belonging to the Government.

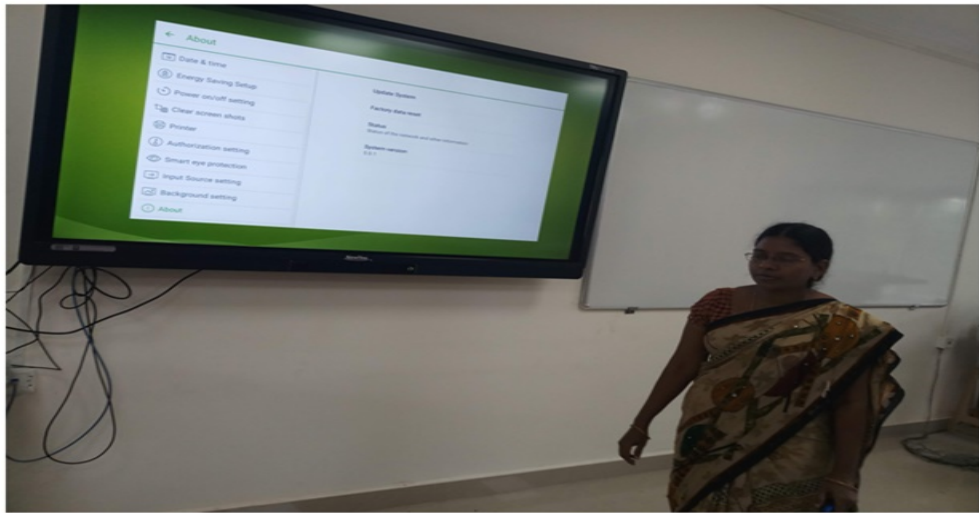

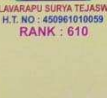

The institution strives to bring holistic development to every student. The college is located in a rural area and has students from socially and economically backward classes. Most of the parents suffer from low educational attainment. Thus it poses a big challenge for the college to empower the students.

The various activities to attain the vision and mission of the college are as follows:

Academic activities: The College has made a significant drift from teacher-centric methods to student centric methods. The ICT classes have been made mandatory and thus eventually students have become familiar and comfortable with the digital mode of teaching. The use of ICT enhanced the learning experience of the student. The students can access the video lessons taught by experts anytime, anywhere that are available as a part of the Learning Management System.

Women Empowerment Cell:

Activities conducted:

The college conducts numerous activities under the umbrella of WEC. Continuous efforts are made to organize various events throughout the year that help to educate the girls' students. A need of the hour in this modern world is to be aware of different kinds of cybercrime. WEC ensures to conduct awareness programs by inviting police personnel, reputed lawyers, and social service activists to educate the students about life hacks. In addition to them, special programmes like Save Girl Child, Beti Padavo, etc., are conducted for the promotion of gender equity. Days of importance like Girl Child's Day, Savithri Bai Phule's Birthday, and International Women's Day are celebrated in a befitting manner.

Programs like Counseling and etiquette are also conducted.

It is believed that **strong personalities build a strong nation**. The importance of Etiquette in this generation, the need of rising to the occasion as the values and etiquettes diminishing in the present generation are addressed. Classroom etiquettes, meeting etiquettes, eating etiquettes, and behavioral etiquettes are extensively imparted to the students through such programs.

WEC ensures that it reaches the girl students of other schools and colleges by observing Girl Child's Day at their campus. They are enlightened about how to protect themselves in times of crisis by using toll-free numbers 1098, 181,100,112. Slogans like "Balika ante kaadu bharam-bharathi ki bangaru haram" are made the theme of the day.

Self-defense program:

Self-defense training programs for girls are also organized to make them self-reliant. The women students of the college are given training in self-defense by qualified trainers. Masters N.GiriVenkata Ramana and M.Ganesh trained our students with

many self-defense techniques. The institution deploys all its machinery towards the overall development of the women students including encouragement of students to participate in sports and games, yoga etc., WEC staff and student members supervised the classes. The outcome is visible in their success in academics and extra-curricular activities. Ms B. Vijaya Naga Lakshmi student of B.A won the National level Bronze medal in Kickboxing competitions held at Andhra University, Visakhapatnam. She fought against a woman student from Punjab University.

STREE HITHA:

StreeHitha embarked on molding the women students who enter its portals into powerful tools of social change by making the women students knowledgeable, strong, confident, and courageous. They are also made aware of their rights and privileges. They participate actively in rallies organized by NGOs on women's issues. The women empowerment cell also hosts a parenting awareness program for the parents of women students to make them aware of the importance of women's education in the wake of early marriages and the increased dropout rate of women students at the higher education level. Guest lectures on health & hygiene by eminent professionals, and Motivation Lectures by women achievers are some of the flagship programs organized by the WEC for STREEHITHA.

Outreach programs such as round table discussions on burning topics like Domestic Violence and Sexual Exploitation are also conducted. Women from nearby villages are also allowed to participate in such events. This gives a platform for the victims to share their experiences with domestic violence. Students are encouraged to put forward their opinions and suggestions on such issues.
